1. **CALL TO ORDER:** 5:04 p.m.

2. **ROLL CALL/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:**

Commissioners Present – Commissioners DaCosta, Flores, Hook, and Chair Parilla

Commissioners Absent – Commissioner Khan

Commissioner Khan arrived at 5:37 p.m.

Staff Members Present – City Manager Nissen, Deputy Engineer Indrawan, Senior Administrative Analyst Tran, Assistant Police Chief Forbes, Battalion Chief Scribner, and Recording Secretary Wuence.

The Pledge of Allegiance was presented by Chair Parilla.

3. **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

Richard Duran, resident, noted concern regarding items that were taken from his open garage late at night. He also noted concern regarding unsafe speeds at Cedar Creek and Schleisman.

4. **PRESENTATIONS:**

City Manager Nissen introduced Battalion Chief Justin Scribner and provided background information on his experience.

4.1 **Monthly Police Department Update**

Lieutenant Forbes provided the staff report for this item.

He provided a summary of calls for service and traffic statistics for the month, including collisions and citations for the period.

He reviewed the results of a recent DUI/Safety checkpoint. He noted that personnel from the Jurupa Valley Station participated in the Law Enforcement Torch Run through Eastvale raising awareness for Special Olympics Games. He noted that Coffee with a Cop was held on June 17 and was a tremendous success. He noted that a new radar trailer was delivered and would be rotated throughout the city.

He noted that portions of Citrus would be closed throughout the weekend of June 26-28 for Picnic in the Park. He noted that Eastvale Police and CNUSD would distribute Vehicle Safety and Pedestrian Safety flyers to parents of K-8 students.

4.2 **Fire Department Update**

Chief Scribner provided the staff report for this item.

He provided a summary of calls for service from January through June and noted that the new fire station and engine would help alleviate the workload on Station 27 and other stations in the surrounding areas. He noted that Fire Safety Specialist, Sandie Hastings, was performing plan check reviews. He reviewed the staff and equipment that would be available at Picnic in the Park.

5. **CONSENT CALENDAR:**

5.1 **Minutes –**

Commissioner DaCosta inquired where the stickers could be obtained. There was discussion regarding the need for Asian language translations on the stickers. There was discussion regarding number of calls received and priority level of scavenging calls for service.

Commissioner Khan arrived at 5:36 p.m.

Motion: Moved by DaCosta, seconded by Hook, to receive and file the Consent Calendar.

Motion carried 5-0 with Flores, DaCosta, Khan, Hook, and Chair Parilla voting aye.

6. **BUSINESS ITEMS:**

6.1 **Status Report on Schleisman Road and Dairy Street/Raymond Drive Traffic Study & Speed Survey Results**

Recommendation: Receive report for discussion.

Deputy Engineer Indrawan provided a PowerPoint presentation for this item.

He reviewed the traffic collisions that have occurred at the location and the measures taken. He noted the Safety Enhancements implemented and stated that Community Outreach would be via a Community Meeting in early or mid-July.

Commissioner DaCosta stepped away from dais at 5:44 p.m.

He noted that a speed survey was conducted and the recommendation for speed limit on that section of Schleisman would be 45 mph.

Commissioner DaCosta returned to dais at 5:48 p.m.

Deputy Engineer Indrawan noted that the City was awarded grant SB821 in the amount of \$137,500.

It was noted that there were no traffic collisions at the intersection since May 20.

6.2 **E-Cigarettes & Vapor**

Recommendation: Receive verbal update from staff and discuss.

City Manager Nissen presented the staff report for this item.

The commission reviewed additional research on the topic provided in the staff report.

It was decided that the item would be tabled for discussion at the next Public Safety Commission Meeting.

Staff would provide an additional study regarding medical facts on formaldehyde byproduct in e-cigarette as well as the position of neighboring cities on the issue.

It was requested that the City Attorney provide counsel to the Commission regarding the issue.

Motion: Moved by DaCosta, seconded by Hook, to continue the item to the next Public Safety Commission Meeting.

Motion carried 5-0 with Flores, DaCosta, Khan, Hook, and Chair Parilla voting aye.

7. ***FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS:***

There were no future agenda items.

8. CITY STAFF REPORT:

City Manager Nissen reviewed a map of Reagan Elementary and the surrounding areas and noted that it would be used to promote walking, biking, scooting to school. She noted that all Eastvale schools have the same map and resources available.

She noted that Reagan Elementary was hosting a walk-through of the school site for all citizens that evening at 6:30 p.m. She invited commissioners to attend the event.

She noted that National Night Out would be held on August 11 in the Target parking lot.

9. COMMISSION COMMUNICATIONS:

Commissioner Khan congratulated the City Manager on her recent appointment. He noted that many issues being raised by residents could be addressed by a Neighborhood Watch program and requested the Commission explore ways to help the program grow.

City Manager Nissen noted that getting citizens to take ownership of their Neighborhood Watch program is the biggest obstacle and staff would continue to promote the program. She noted that staff would need to prepare a policy on Neighborhood Watch signage costs.

Assistant Police Chief Forbes noted that Deputy Cryder would be transitioning to another position and Deputy Myers would replace him.

City Manager Nissen noted that a motor officer would begin working in Eastvale in the fall.

Chair Parilla requested that the Police Department Update provide statistics on auto and residential burglary reports taken.

Vice Chair Hook inquired about tractors traveling on Hamner to the Silverlakes project. Deputy Engineer Indrawan and Assistant Police Chief Forbes noted that they would look into the issue and come back to the Commission with information.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:15 p.m.





BACKGROUND

Staff members of the City of Eastvale, Corona Norco Unified School District (CNUSD) and the Riverside County Sheriff's Department have been working on a collaborative outreach and education plan to help address school traffic for the new school year.

DISCUSSION

CNUSD sent out a message via blackboard in the evening on June 30, 2015 and again Sunday, July 5, 2015 to inform parents about the collaborative efforts being undertaken by the City of Eastvale, CNUSD, and the Riverside County Sheriff's Department to promote bicycle, pedestrian and traffic safety. As you know, this is an ongoing effort to ensure the safety of our students and it is our hope that this campaign effort will continue to raise awareness all year long.

The content of the CNUSD messages (email & text) are attached for your reference. A digital brochure can also be found on the CNUSD website (www.cnusd.k12.ca.us) as well as on the Crime Prevention, Fire Prevention and Safety page of the City's website. The announcement and brochure were also published on the City's website and distributed through E-Notification and social media on Sunday, July 26, 2015.

You will also begin to see yard signs and/or banners that promote traffic safety throughout CNUSD. Signs will be located in allowable areas within the City but mostly on CNUSD school sites.

The attached brochure was funded in part by CNUSD and the City of Eastvale for distribution to each student. The Riverside County Sheriff's Department (Eastvale PD) will have an increased presence around the school sites to ensure compliance with traffic safety. It is our goal to increase awareness and reduce the number of accidents at and around our school sites.

Unattended Child in Vehicle: A parent, legal guardian, or other person responsible for a child who is 6 years of age or younger may not leave that child inside a motor vehicle without being subject to the supervision of a person who is 12 years of age or older. **CVC 15620(a), 22516**



Disabled Parking: Unless a vehicle displays a disabled license plate or placard, you may not park in parking spaces designated for the disabled by blue lines or signs, nor in the cross-hatched area adjacent to them. **CVC 22507.8**



No U-Turn Sign: It is unlawful for a driver of a vehicle to fail to obey a sign or signal. **CVC 21461 (a)**



No Parking Signs: You may not stop or park your vehicle, whether occupied or not, except while actually engaged in loading or unloading merchandise or passengers. **CVC 463, 22505, 22506, 22507**



Cell Phones: A person shall not drive a motor vehicle while using a wireless telephone unless that telephone is specifically designed and configured to allow hands-free listening and talking, and is used in that manner while driving. **CVC 23123 (a)**



Passing a Stopped School Bus: When approaching a school bus, from either direction, that is stopped for the loading or unloading of school children, and which displays a flashing red light signal and stop signal arm, you must immediately stop and shall not proceed until the flashing red light and stop arm cease operation. **CVC 22454 (a)**



U-Turn in Residential District: You shall not make a U-Turn in a residential district when any other vehicle is approaching from either direction within 200 feet, except at an intersection when the approaching vehicle is controlled by an official traffic control device. **CVC 22103**

Impeding Traffic: You may not drive your vehicle upon a highway at a slow speed as to impede or block the normal and reasonable movement of traffic. Please do not unload your children from the traffic lane and allow them to walk between vehicles in motion. **CVC 22400 (a)**



Double Parking / Unlawful Curb Parking: You may not park on the street adjacent to another parked vehicle. Vehicles parked must be within 18" from the curb. **CVC 22500 (h), CVC 22502 (a)**

Red Curbs: No Stopping, standing, or parking, whether the vehicle is attended or unattended. **CVC 21458 (a) (1)**

The Corona-Norco Unified School District is dedicated to the safety and well-being of all students, parents, community members, and staff. This brochure was written in collaboration with the Riverside Sheriff's Department and the Corona Police Department to provide clarification on laws related to the operation of vehicles in school zones and provide basic bicycle and pedestrian safety tips.



Bicycle Safety

Safety Tips for Motorists

- Slow down near bicyclists.
- Pay attention and avoid driving distractions.
- Look for bicyclists before opening your car door.
- Be aware of oncoming bicyclists when making a left turn.
- Check your blind spot for bicyclists before turning right.
- Always maintain a distance of no less than 3 feet while passing a bicyclist.
- In the event you are involved in an accident on or near school grounds, contact administration and law enforcement.



Safety Tips for Bicyclists

- Ride with the flow of traffic, not against it.
- Ride with a white front light at night.
- Be visible. Don't hug the curb and ride in a straight line.
- Stop at red lights and stop signs.
- Ride 3-5 feet to the left of parked cars to avoid opening doors.
- Always wear a helmet and never ride with headphones.
- Be predictable and use hand signals.
- Always secure your bike when not in use. The District is not responsible for the theft of personal property. **BP 5460**



Tips to Pick Up and Drop Off Children at School

1. Seat belt ALL passengers.
2. Children 12 and under must ride in back seat.
3. Position your child so they exit curbside, away from traffic.
4. Plan enough time to account for traffic.
5. Familiarize yourself with school drop-off and pick-up practices and always follow them.
6. If the curb says "No stopping or parking at any time," that means for everyone. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
7. Do not block crosswalks or fire zone areas.
8. Do not position your vehicle where you will have to back up after drop off.
9. Put your vehicle in **PARK** and use your **EMERGENCY BRAKE**.
10. Carpool when possible.
11. Refrain from using any electronic device when behind the wheel.
12. Discuss traffic rules with your child.
13. Take your child to the drop-off area and "practice" at an off-peak time.
14. Explain the purpose of crossing guards.
15. Teach children to use marked crosswalks (walk, never run).
16. Remind children to never enter the street from between parked cars.
17. Have children look left, look right, then look left again when crossing the street.



Speed Limits: The speed limit in school zones is 25 mph when children are present, unless the posted signs show lower speed. **CVC 22352 (a) (2) (B)**

Fire Lanes: You may not park or leave your vehicle standing, whether attended or unattended, in any location, public or private, that is designated as a fire lane. **CVC 22500.1**

Jaywalking: You may not walk in the middle of the street that has a traffic control signal at each adjacent intersection. **CVC 21954, 21955**

Crossing Guards: It is unlawful to disobey the traffic directions of a traffic guard. **CVC 2815**



Crosswalks: You may not stop or park blocking a marked crosswalk. Vehicles must yield right-of-way to pedestrians in a marked crosswalk or unmarked crosswalk at an intersection. **CVC 21970, 22500 (a) & (b), 21950**



Fire Hydrants: You may not park within 15 feet of a fire hydrant. **CVC 22514 (a)**

Park or Parking: "Park or parking" means the standing of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, other than temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading merchandise or passengers. **CVC 463**



SUBJECT: VAPING & E-CIGARETTES

RECOMMENDATION: RECEIVE AND FILE

BACKGROUND

At the May 26, 2015 and June 23, 2015 Public Safety Commission meetings, the commissioners requested additional research about vaping and electronic cigarettes.

DISCUSSION:

At the June 23rd commission meeting, staff provided additional research on the subject matter. Since the last commission meeting, a citizen has also approached city council members on the topic.

At the July 22, 2015 City Council Meeting, council members discussed the item during City Council comments. At this time, the directive to City staff via consensus was to suspend any further staff activity on the matter. City Council also directed the Riverside County Sheriff's Department to monitor the situation and advise of any increase in complaints and/or unlawful activity related to vaping and e-cigarettes.

The Riverside County Sheriff's Department has stated that there is no significant unlawful activity at this time. Furthermore, enforcement in public areas related to parks and recreation is handled by Jurupa Community Services District (JCSD) who currently has an enforcement policy in place. The Corona-Norco Unified School District (CNUSD) also has a similar policy in place regarding school property. Both policies were previously provided to the commission. The Riverside County Sheriff's Department will monitor the situation and advise of any increase in unlawful activity related to vaping and e-cigarettes.

No further action is to be taken by staff.

SUBJECT: CERT TRAINING UPDATE

RECOMMENDATION: RECEIVE AND FILE

BACKGROUND

The State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) is a federal program that awards grants funding for the implementation of programs to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism and other catastrophic events. The City of Eastvale applied for and was awarded a 2014/2015 SHSP Grant to provide Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) trainings.

DISCUSSION

The City of Eastvale offered a CERT Medical Refresher course on July 11, 2015 as part of our grant funded operations. There were a total of 17 participants, from various cities. The training lasted nearly 4 hours. Jurupa Community Services District (JCSO) co-hosted the class by providing a training location.

CERT trainings consist of a two and a half day course designed to provide education on disaster preparedness and response. Individuals who undergo CERT training develop a better understanding of potential threats that may affect their homes, workplaces, and communities. Upcoming CERT trainings dates include the weekends of September 11, 2015 and January 8, 2016. JCSO has agreed to allow the City to use their board room for CERT trainings. The class location address is: 11201 Harrel Street, Jurupa Valley, CA 91752.

Registration for CERT trainings will be handled by County OES. County OES has provided the City and JCSO with fliers directing interested parties to an online registration portal for the upcoming September 11, 2015 class. The City will provide registrants with a CERT backpack equipped disaster response supplies such as caution tape, safety goggles, and gloves (95 units purchased under the City's 13/14 SHSP Grant). They will also be provided with CERT Basic Training Participant Manual. Class registration will be limited to no more than 50 participants.

FISCAL IMPACT

None. The City will fund Material and Instructor Costs through the 14/15 SHSP Grant award. Training location will be provided by JCSO at no charge.
