**1. CALL TO ORDER:** 6:06 p.m.

**2. ROLL CALL/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:**

Commissioners Present – Commissioners DaCosta, Flores, Parilla, Vice-Chair Khan, Chair Hook

Staff Members Present – City Manager Nissen, City Engineer Indrawan, Manager of Public Works Alvarez, and Recording Secretary Urtado.

The pledge of allegiance was presented by Chair Hook.

**3. PUBLIC COMMENT:**

Aaron Smith, resident, expressed his concerns regarding mail theft, paintball attacks, dog bites, as well as street racers.

Cindy Quach, resident, provided an update on the Neighborhood Watch in her neighborhood. She noted that despite the increase of households participating in the local Neighborhood Watch, there is paranoia and tension among residents due to recent vehicle and mailbox break-ins, and burglaries.

**4. PRESENTATIONS:**

**4.1 Monthly Police Department Update**

Lieutenant Forbes provided the staff report for this item. He provided a summary of the calls for service and traffic statistics for the period, noting the positive impact of the motor officer.

Lieutenant Forbes addressed the public comment regarding mail theft, noting that there is a partnership with postal inspectors and that there is a special enforcement team that is following up with leads that they may have to identify and arrest persons responsible for mail thefts. He also noted that there has been one arrest to date, and have identified a second suspect involved, in which a warrant has been issued for that person's arrest.

In regards to speeding, there was discussion regarding multiple complaints of speeding and racing on Celebration Drive. Lieutenant Forbes noted that with the

use of targeted enforcement, a total of thirty five citations have been issued. In addition, he noted that on February 16, 2016 City Manager Nissen, City of Eastvale staff, and the City of Eastvale traffic sergeant met with residents on Celebration Drive regarding their ongoing concerns. Traffic control measures were discussed and are being evaluated.

Chair Hook inquired about insight from the Postal Service, if any, about the recent mailbox thefts and the pattern of them being broken into through the use of a master key. Lieutenant Forbes that he could not comment on behalf of the postmaster.

Commissioner Flores inquired about resident Aaron Smith's concerns regarding mailbox thefts. There was discussion about the use of cameras on or near mailboxes. Lieutenant Forbes noted that cameras can be placed on homes neighboring mailboxes, as well as in public places. City Engineer Indrawan noted cameras are not allowed in public right of way, a permit would be needed, but at this point it is not something that is acceptable. Commissioner DaCosta expressed his experience with mail theft and noted that cameras at the homes in his neighborhood have cameras aimed towards mailboxes, noting that it could be an option for other concerned residents.

City Manager Nissen noted that it was not the City of Eastvale's decision to put cluster mailboxes; USPS made that decision as a result of staffing challenges. She also noted that it is the homeowner's responsibility to maintain their mailboxes, but developers will now be conditioned to be liable for mailboxes.

In response to resident Smith's concerns regarding paintball attacks, Commissioner DaCosta inquired if there is a vehicle code prohibiting the throwing or shooting of objects from a vehicle. Lieutenant Forbes noted that there is a vehicle code regarding throwing objects out of a vehicle, it is considered loitering. In regards to the specifics of objects, Lieutenant Forbes noted he is unaware of any section stating specific objects. Commissioner DaCosta inquired if the shooting or throwing of objects could be citable, and Lieutenant Forbes stated that it would depend on the circumstances in each situation.

Commissioner DaCosta addressed resident Aaron Smith's concerns of dog bites at public parks, and recommended that such concerns be expressed to Animal Control.

Motion carried 5-0 with DaCosta, Flores, Parilla, Vice-Chair Khan, and Chair Hook voting aye.

**6. BUSINESS ITEMS:**

6.1 **School Liaison Reports –**

RECOMMENDATION: Receive verbal updates from each Commissioner.

City Manager Nissen expressed her apologies to Chair Hook and the Commissioners noting that she did not provide contact information for the Principals from each school.

Commissioner Flores noted that he did contact the Principal at Harada Elementary School via e-mail, but has not been contacted back.

Vice-Chair Khan stated he got a chance to speak with the Principal at Rosa Parks Elementary School and the Assistant Principal at Ramirez Intermediate School. He noted that they had overlapping concerns regarding traffic on Harrison Avenue, and requested information regarding the possibility of a crossing guard on Harrison Avenue and Whispering Hills Drive. He also noted that Principal Verduzco from Rosa Parks Elementary expressed her concern of emergency medical response times and the location that responders are arriving at. City Manager Nissen discussed crossing guard data and noted that school districts have a required threshold set by the state regarding the number of crossing guards.

Commissioner Parilla noted that he had nothing to report from Ronald Reagan Elementary School, but noted that Principal Helms is very active in her role with traffic safety around the school.

Chair Hook noted that he is working with Eastvale Elementary School and River Heights Intermediate School, and noted they share the same traffic concerns. Both schools have worked with a deputy sheriff and have seen a positive impact with their presence. Chair Hook has met with staff from Eleanor Roosevelt High School and will continue to meet with them regarding their concerns with traffic congestion and safety. He noted that all three schools have seen a decrease in traffic issues as a result from the presence of the motor officer.

## 6.2 **Bicycle Master Plan –**

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends that the Public Safety Commission recommend that the City Council adopt the City of Eastvale Bicycle Master Plan.

Manager of Public Works Alvarez presented the consultant and provided background on the City of Eastvale Bicycle Master Plan, noting that the Planning Commission recommended that the City Council adopt the City of Eastvale Bicycle Master Plan.

The consultant, John Holloway, provided a PowerPoint presentation for the item. Mr. Holloway provided facility type information, programs, and policies.

Commissioner Flores initiated discussion on whether it is permitted to ride a bicycle on a sidewalk, in which it was noted by Lieutenant Forbes and City Manager Alvarez that is permitted to do so.

Chair Hook inquired if there is discussion in the City of Eastvale Bicycle Master Plan on removing traffic lanes. Commissioner Parilla also expressed his concern regarding removing lanes. Manager of Public Works Alvarez noted the City of Eastvale has an excess of street width, in which initiated discussion regarding reducing lane size as an option, as opposed to removing traffic lanes.

City Manager Nissen added that there was a significant amount of outreach that went into producing the document. She noted that there were multiple meetings that the City of Eastvale held, as well as community outreach and education throughout the City of Eastvale. She stated that the City of Eastvale Bicycle Master Plan is just a blueprint that would allow for the City of Eastvale to be eligible to pursue grant opportunities.

Commissioner Flores inquired if cyclists would be allowed to the regular portion of the roadway, particularly at an intersection. Lieutenant Forbes noted that cyclists are permitted to use a lane of traffic in addition to a bicycle lane.

Motion: Moved by Vice-Chair Khan, seconded by Flores, to recommend that the City Council adopt the City of Eastvale Bicycle Master Plan.

Motion carried 5-0 with DaCosta, Flores, Parilla, Vice-Chair Khan, and Chair Hook voting aye.

**6.3 Citywide Truck Route Study Update –**

RECOMMENDATION: Discuss report.

City Engineer Indrawan provided the staff report for this item.

City Engineer Indrawan provided background information on the Truck Route Study to provide truck routes in the City of Eastvale. He provided information regarding the study, noting that the City of Eastvale is working with neighboring cities such as Ontario, Chino, Norco, and Jurupa Valley. He noted that as the study develops, public meetings will take place.

**6.4 Sheriff's Department Update –**

RECOMMENDATION: Receive verbal update.

The item was addressed during the Monthly Police Department Update.

**7. CITY STAFF REPORT:**

City Manager Nissen noted that there was a citizen concern from Julie Rust, an Eastvale resident, regarding concerns at Schleisman Road and Sumner Avenue. She noted that Ms. Rust's concerns will tie into the Truck Route Study, and city staff will continue to have conversations with her.

City Manager Nissen invited the Commissioners to the Circle City Meeting taking place prior to the City Council Meeting on February 24, 2016, regarding new electrical lines that would run through the City of Eastvale. She also asked commissioners to attend the Budget Workshop Meetings, in which overviews the budget, reviews goal settings, and plans.

City Manager Nissen also invited Commissioners to participate in Read Across America, the week of March 2, 2016. She noted that Rosa Parks Elementary School would appreciate commissioner participation throughout the Read Across America week, March 1<sup>st</sup>-March 4<sup>th</sup>, 2016.

City Manager Nissen encouraged participation in the Every Fifteen Minutes Program taking place at Eleanor Roosevelt High School.

City Engineer Indrawan announced that the BEYOND Funding Agreement has been received by the City of Eastvale, and will be going to City Council for funding agreement approval. He noted the bidding process for the purchase of ten-twelve radar signs will begin, and all of the radar signs will be near local schools. Also, he noted that during March meetings city staff will be bring information regarding policies and purchases of three cameras to City Council.

City Engineer Indrawan noted that traffic signal synchronization construction at Hamner Avenue is near completion, within thirty to sixty days. Also, construction on River Road, between Hall Road and Hellman Avenue, will begin upon Traffic Control Plan approval from the City of Chino.

Commissioner DaCosta thanked staff for their hard work, and thanked staff for the placement of the speed trailer by Clara Barton Elementary School noting that it was helpful and effective.

City Manager Nissen noted that the State of the City Address will take place on April 5, 2016. She also noted that although there is no set date yet, National Night Out will take place in the City of Norco this year.

#### **8. COMMISSION COMMUNICATIONS:**

Commissioner Flores inquired the sheriff's department about response times for loud party calls and information regarding their reserve program. There was discussion regarding the prioritization of loud party calls and the response times. Commissioner Parilla also inquired about loud party calls, and asked if there is data that is collected in which could reveal the amount of calls that are regarding loud parties.

Commissioner DaCosta thanked the citizens who attended the meeting and thanked them for voicing their concerns.

Vice-Chair Khan noted that he volunteered to give a legislative update on public safety. He noted that he met in Sacramento regarding bills that have not been passed or vetoed. He noted he would send an e-mail to anyone interested regarding remaining bills that have not been passed or vetoed.

Chair Hook noted that he attended the quarterly school board meeting with City Manager Nissen. He also noted he attended the City Council Meeting on February 10, 2016 and discussed what took place in the meeting.

Chair Hook noted that resident Cindy Quach has extended an invitation to commissioners regarding the Neighborhood Watch event that she is hosting.

#### **9. FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS:**

There were no requests for future agenda items.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:11 p.m.

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## Development Projects

### Residential Projects Under Construction:

Tract 36382 – Lennar Homes (Eastvale Project # 12-0275)

- Location: South side of Citrus Street between Scholar Way at Sumner Ave
  - Public Improvement 95% complete
  - Homes under construction
  - “No-Right Turn, 7-9am” symbol signs were added for eastbound Citrus Street traffic at Granja Vista Del Rio/ H.S. driveway beginning May 6, 2015.

Tract 34014 – DR Horton – Copper Sky (Eastvale Project # 13-0395)

- Location: Southeast corner of Schleisman Road at Scholar Way
  - Public Improvement 90% complete
  - Homes on Phase I south of Schleisman are under construction
  - Schleisman Rd was opened on March 29, 2015 for traffic.
  - Access from Beckett Field Lane was open to traffic on September 1, 2015.
  - Portion south of Schleisman Road near build-out

Tract 36423 – DR Horton (Eastvale Project # 11-0558)

- Location: Northwest corner of Archibald Avenue at 65<sup>th</sup> Street
  - Public Improvement 90% complete
  - Homes under construction; few phases are occupied
  - SCE completed the relocation of transmission poles on November 20, 2015.
  - Widening of west side of Archibald between 65<sup>th</sup> and north project limits (including Providence Project frontage) to be completed in June 2016

Tract 32821-1 – KB Home – The Lodge (205 Units, Eastvale Project 10-0124)

- Location: Northwest corner of Limonite at Scholar Way
  - Public Improvement 90% complete
  - Homes under construction; few phases are occupied
  - Developer is working to start grading of Phase II of the project (TR 32821, southwest corner of 58<sup>th</sup> and Scholar) in January 2016.
  - Model homes open
  - Construction and grading ongoing

Tract 31406 – Meritage Homes (Eastvale Project # 10-0140)

- Location: Southwest corner of Archibald Avenue at River Road
  - Punch List has been issued; developer has scheduled repairs.

Tract 31476 – Beazer Homes (Eastvale Project # 12-0679)

- Location: Northeast corner of Hellman Avenue at Walters Street
  - Punch List has been issued

Tract 29997 – Lennar Homes – Mill Creek Crossing (122-Units, Eastvale Project # 12-0297)

- Southeast corner of Hellman Avenue at Chandler
  - Public Improvements 90%
  - Production homes under construction
  - Hellman Street was reopened on July 8, 2015
  - Chandler between Hall and Hellman and Hellman Avenue between Chandler Street and 300 north reconstruction was completed and opened to traffic on November 20, 2015
  - Traffic Signal at the intersection of Chandler Street and Hellman Avenue is expected to be installed and operational by March 2016.

Tract 30971 – KB Home – The Lodge (205 Units, Eastvale Project # 10-0016)

- Location: Limonite Avenue behind 24 Hour Fitness
- Final Plans Approved
- Began Grading Operations on April 2015
- Building permits for Model Homes and production homes have been issued
- Main access road has been constructed and is available to prospective buyers.
- Model Homes Open.
- Phase I homes are under construction
- Phase II Master Home Plan approved December 3, 2015.

TTM 36775 – Stratham Homes (319 Units, Project No. 14-1398)

- Location: Northwest corner of Limonite Avenue at Harrison Avenue
- Project conditionally approved by Planning Commission
- Revised site plan presented to City Council on September 9, 2015 and Council was supportive of the revised site layout.
- Applicant has submitted a parcel map to divide the site into 4 parcels for financing purposes. Phase 1 map, improvement plans and engineering studies have gone through a first plan check.

## Ronald Reagan Elementary School

- Location: Northeast corner of Fieldmaster Street at Cherry Creek Circle
  - School opened on July 6, 2015
  - Traffic is being monitored for improvement recommendations
  - Met with school principal and school district traffic investigator to review and discuss traffic circulation around the school. Traffic Counts were conducted and analysis identified that a school crossing guard is not warranted at the intersection of Fieldmaster at Cherry Creek (north), Fielmaster at Fall Creek, and Cherry Creek at Sunny Brook.
  - Additional traffic data collected and analysis to be completed March 2016 for the intersection of Oosten Farms/Fielmaster at Cherry Creek (south), Cherry Creek at Fern Creek, Cherry Creek at Rolling Stream and for Cherry Creek at Wind River. Results will be provided as soon as available.

## Providence Business Park

- Location: West side of Archibald Avenue south of Limonite Avenue
  - Street improvement plans have been approved for Archibald Avenue
  - SCE completed the relocation of transmission poles on November 20, 2015.
  - Widening of west side of Archibald within project limits (including DR Horton Tract to the south) is tentatively scheduled to begin in March 2016.

## Chevron Gas Station (former Arco Gas Station)

- Location: Southeast corner of Hamner Avenue at Riverside Drive
  - Plan review is underway
  - Developer anticipates construction and grading to start in near future

## Goodman Commerce Center (Project No. 11-0271)

- Location: Northeast corner of Hamner Avenue at Bellegrave Avenue
  - Mass Grading Permit was Issued on April 16, 2015
  - Pre-Grade Meeting has been scheduled for the last week in April 2015
  - Ground Breaking Ceremony held on May 20, 2015
  - Currently grading the site and constructing utility services
  - Building permit for Building 2, closest to Bellegrave, has been issued. All perimeter walls for Building 2 have been erected and the building roof is 35% complete.

  - Widening of Cantu-Galleano Ranch Road on the south was started on December 1, 2015 and is expected to be completed by March 2016. (schedule subject to change)

  - Hamner Avenue street improvement is scheduled to start in March 2016




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**RECOMMENDATION: PROVIDE DIRECTION ON POSSIBLE MEETING TIME CHANGE FOR PUBLIC SAFETY COMMISSION MEETINGS.**

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## **BACKGROUND**

Currently, the Public Safety Commission meets on the fourth Tuesday of each month at 6:00 p.m. Meetings take place in the Multi-Purpose Room at Rosa Parks Elementary School. This current meeting time was chosen by the Public Safety Commission on February 24, 2015. However, it is important to note that this meeting has been held at different times to try to better accommodate the public and increase attendance at the meetings. Originally, the meeting was held on the third Friday of the month at 4:00 p.m. The other meeting time changes were as follows:

- July 15, 2013 - Fourth Friday of the month at 4:30 p.m.
- January 28, 2014 - Fourth Tuesday of the month at 4:30 p.m.
- February 24, 2015 – Fourth Tuesday of the month at 6:00 p.m.

## **DISCUSSION**

There has been some discussion by the community, the City Council and the Public Safety Commission about meeting times and holding them at a later time to better accommodate members of the public that commute to jobs in other cities. This item has been brought forward at the request of Chairman Hook to give the Public Safety Commission the opportunity to discuss this issue. Chairman Hook has proposed a meeting time of 7:00 p.m. based on the feedback he received from constituents.

Neighboring cities don't have Public Safety Commissions to compare meeting times to, however, the City of Jurupa Valley has a Traffic Safety Committee which meets on a bi-monthly basis on the fourth Thursday of the month at 3:00 p.m. A comparison can be made to Planning Commission meeting times in neighboring cities. The City of Corona and Eastvale's Planning Commission both meet at 6:00 p.m. and the City of Ontario's Planning Commission meets at 6:30 p.m. The Cities of Chino, Jurupa Valley and Norco's Planning Commission's all meet at 7:00 p.m.
