



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

Although I am one of many residents that recently moved in to Eastvale from Chino Hills, I strongly feel that I can bring great value to the City. First of all, I am quite familiar with the City and the history of its incorporation because I was one of the planners that worked in Riverside County that worked with development community in building the city. In fact, I was glad to see that the Neighborhood Preservation Standards that I helped to write is still being used by the the Code. I also have extensive experience in working with local governments. After working at the County for 8 years, I took a position at San Bernardino Associated Governments (SANBAG) which is equivalent to RCTC and WRCOG in Riverside County. At SANBAG, I manage various planning and transportation projects in coordination with the local jurisdictions. To assist local cities, I constantly monitor and deal with the complex and bureaucratic State, Federal, and Regional government funding, legislative, and guideline development processes. At least until November, the Council needs someone who can step in and understand how a city functions with minimal training with the staff. Except for some project specific background, I can easily digest the council agenda items and make informed decision for our community

WHAT DO YOU FEEL ARE THE MOST IMPORTANT ISSUES FACING THE CITY OF EASTVALE?:

I am a conservative when it comes to government. This means I believe in personal responsibility with smaller govt., but that does not mean that government is absent and cannot be utilized, especially at a local level. There are several services that the government has to provide. For city governments, they are public safety, infrastructure, economic development (including housing and planning), and quality of life services. To provide for these services, budgeting has to be done right. Every year, the Council has to study and carefully plan finances of the city, otherwise I have seen how budget problems can easily take down a city. People often just look at increasing the revenue side, but it is equally important to look at the expenditure side to always conserve as much as possible. Changing in demographics also play a huge role in how the services are provided in a city. For example Eastvale is right now going through the study to see if district based voting would actually bring benefit to the city. Although in some circumstances, this could give a voice to some members of the minority community, but I would dispute that claim for our city. For small cities like Eastvale who needs to compete to bring outside resources, dividing the city's voice will only create contention among each districts. It will only bring unnecessary competition between the districts. As a conservative, I believe in "healthy competition", but artificially creating a competition to pin each districts against each other is not a healthy competition for Eastvale. After attending some of the Council meetings, I noticed that public safety was discussed several times. (mail theft and bicycle/ped collisions). There are solutions to these community issues, but it takes will of the Council to make them a priority. I have seen many of these issues get addressed by having a Council person takes an advocacy role.

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

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

During the entire course of my work life I was heavily involved in the analysis, interpretation and explanation of business data. Based on my data analysis I implemented and made recommendations to more senior executives about actions that needed to be taken to achieve business improvements.
