1. CALL TO ORDER – 6:00 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioners Present – DaCosta, Flores, Parilla, Vice-Chair Khan, Chair Hook
Commissioners Absent –

Staff Members Present – City Manager Nissen, City Engineer Indrawan, Manager of Public Works Alvarez, Senior Administrative Analyst Irwin, and Recording Secretary Urtado.

The pledge of allegiance was presented by Chair Hook.

3. PRESENTATIONS

3.1 Monthly Police Department Update

Lieutenant Forbes provided the staff report for this item. He introduced Sergeant Bill Davis, whom is in charge of traffic enforcement.

Chair Hook called for a brief recess at 6:04 p.m.

The meeting was called back to order at 6:06 p.m.

Lieutenant Forbes provided a summary of the calls for service and traffic statistics for the month, including operations as well as citations for the period. He provided information about the upcoming Coffee with a Cop set to take place on Thursday June 16, 2016. He also addressed an ongoing investigation on Apple Moss Court, involving birthing homes issues.

Vice-Chair Khan inquired about birthing homes, and if healthcare requirements are being met. Lieutenant Forbes noted that the residents and homeowners are not conducting business, noting that they have claimed to be family and friends occupying the homes. City Manager Nissen noted that Code Enforcement has contacted such homeowners, and have not found any violations at the reported birthing homes.

There was discussion about birthing and group homes, in regards to enforcement and regulations. City Manager Nissen noted that such homes are not regulated on the local level, but on the federal and state level.

3.2 Monthly Fire Department Update

Battalion Chief Scribner provided the staff report for this item. He provided a summary on the average calls per day as well as the average response times.

Battalion Chief Scribner provided an update on the construction of Fire Station No. 31, noting that CERT classes are expected to be available for staff and residents at Fire Station No. 31.

5. BUSINESS ITEMS

5.1 Emergency Management Update

RECOMMENDATION: Receive and file.

Senior Administrative Analyst Irwin provided the staff report for this item.

Senior Administrative Analyst Irwin provided an update on the City of Eastvale's Emergency Operations Plan (EOP), noting that changes are being reviewed, and once the draft is finalized it will be presented at a future Public Safety Commission Meeting for review before being taken to the City Council for approval. In addition, she provided updates on the Emergency Management Performance Grant, the State Homeland Security Program, Staff Training, and the City of Eastvale's Emergency Operation Center.

Senior Administrative Analyst Irwin also noted that a CERT class will be held the weekend of September 16-18.

5.2 Truck Route Study Update

RECOMMENDATION: Receive and file.

City Engineer Indrawan provided the staff report for this item.

City Engineer Indrawan provided an update on the Truck Route Study noting that following the Request for Proposals, City Council approved a Professional Services Agreement with Minagar & Associates, Inc. of Laguna Niguel, California on April 27, 2016.

5.3 Residential Permit Parking Program

RECOMMENDATION: Receive report for discussion and direction to staff.

Manager of Public Works Alvarez provided a presentation for this item.

Manager of Public Works Alvarez provided background information on the item, as well as purpose, process overview, and concerns.

Commissioner Flores inquired about the criteria used to identify the threshold for a parking permit zone, as well as how it is determined. Manager of Public Works Alvarez noted that the City Council would make that decision, and city staff would conduct field surveys. Commissioner Flores then expressed his concerns for the program.

Chair Hook requested information on statistics on criminal activity in zones, and the correlation with permitted parking and crime rates. Lieutenant Forbes noted that he would conduct research and provide more information at the next meeting.

Commissioner Flores inquired about suspicion vehicles and the process used to locate owner and vehicle information. Lieutenant Forbes then explained the process that is used.

Vice-Chair Khan inquired if there are areas in the City of Eastvale that have requested parking permit zones. City Manager Nissen noted that the Estancia community has requested a parking permit program, but that there are inherent challenges in that neighborhood due to the public facility that is near the community. She noted that due to the public facility, the Desi Arnaz house, being near the community, there must be public access available to all residents. She also noted that public streets could not be subject to parking permit systems. In addition, she noted that a Residential Permit Parking Program would primarily be funded from the General Fund, and could result in unintended consequences.

Commissioner Parilla expressed his concerns with a Residential Permit Parking Program. He also expressed his concern with having to take revenue out of the General Fund to subsidize the parking program. In addition, he expressed hesitation to move forward with the item.

Commissioner DaCosta encouraged residents to be aware of and report vehicles that inoperable or have not been moved for more than 72 hours. City Manager Nissen explained that rules are already in place for inoperable vehicles and RVs, and noted that citizens can report violations through the E-Citizen app, which has proven to be successful.

6. PUBLIC COMMENT

Julie Rust, resident, expressed her comments regarding the parking permit program, noting that curfew for parking times have been effective in other cities.

Cindy Quach, resident, thanked law enforcement for their work. In addition, she expressed her approval for a parking permit program.

Silvia Allen, resident, expressed her concerns regarding recent incidents in her neighborhood, as well as the lengthy police response times. She also inquired about who the City of Eastvale contracts with for mutual aid.

Don Pettinger, resident, commented about his crime watch page and the support for law enforcement. He also inquired if the Goodman Commerce Center has after hour security, and if there is anything being done to address street racers on Scholar Way. In addition, he commented on implementing more events for residents to interact with law enforcement, as well as creating more Neighborhood Watch Programs in the City of Eastvale.

Chair Hook encouraged Mr. Pettinger to direct questions about the Goodman project to the City Council and city staff.

City Manager Nissen addressed Mr. Pettinger's questions, noting that Goodman does have on site after hour security, and once the new building is opened, a large security firm will be employed.

Lieutenant Forbes addressed Mr. Pettinger's comments regarding the racers on Scholar Way, he encouraged residents to report racers. He noted that although an officer would probably be unable to cite the racers, the Sheriff's department would be able to narrow times and track potential patterns. In addition, he expressed his support of the crime watch page and idea the idea of a community meeting with law enforcement.

7. CITY STAFF REPORT

City Manager Nissen provided an update on upcoming events.

City Manager Nissen provided information on how residents could download complete agenda packets for City Council and Commission meetings. She also encouraged citizens to utilize the E-Citizen app to send service requests to city staff.

City Manager Nissen also provided an update on the BEYOND initiative, which involves radar speed sign installations near school sites. She also noted that drainage pipes in the city that have caused issues been closed off.

Commissioner Flores inquired if the Sheriff Department has explored overtime costs, regarding deputies working overtime on the weekend. Lieutenant Forbes and City Manager Nissen explained overtime budget and targeted enforcement. There was discussion regarding deputy staffing.

Vice-Chair Khan inquired about the City of Eastvale reserve budget that was provided in the PowerPoint presentation. City Manager Nissen explained the reserve budget and the restricted funds.

Commissioner DaCosta asked if the Sheriff Department currently has any mutual aid agreement. Lieutenant Forbes explained the current mutual aid agreement with surrounding police departments, noting that sometimes incidents do not warrant a mutual aid response.

Commissioner Flores inquired about audits within the Sheriff's Department. City Manager Nissen elaborated on the audits that occur, noting that the department is monitored and audited.

City Engineer Indrawan noted that in regards to radar signs, each school in the City of Eastvale will receive radar signs, noting that Scholar Way will receive multiple radar signs.

8. COMMISSION COMMUNICATIONS

Vice-Chair Khan expressed his support and appreciation for the crime watch page that resident Pettinger commented about.

Vice-Chair Khan requested that city staff regularly notify residents of ways to provide public comment if they are unable to attend a meeting.

Chair Hook encouraged citizens to use the E-Citizen app.

Commissioner DaCosta thanked and expressed his appreciation to city staff and Lieutenant Forbes for all of their updates and hard work. In regards to Mr. Pettinger's comments, Commissioner DaCosta noted that street racing occurs at sporadic times and encouraged citizens to report street racers. He also noted that he would not be in attendance at the next regular Public Safety Commission Meeting.

9. FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

Chair Hook requested more information on parking permit statistics or a potential parking ordinance, and potential impacts. Commissioner Flores requested information on the fiscal impact of a parking permit program. City Manager Nissen noted that such information would be provided. Commissioner Parilla requested information on how many hours city staff has spent researching the parking permit program. City Manager Nissen noted that city staff has spent approximately 10 hours researching the parking permit program.

Vice-Chair Khan requested information regarding an overview of the results of the Rental Registration Program, city staff hours that are used towards administering on the Rental Registration Program, and how the program has affected crime rates. City Manager Nissen noted that this topic is currently set to be a future agenda item and that the program has shown a significant decrease in grow houses. Vice-Chair Khan inquired if there was any correlation between grow houses and registered rental properties. City Manager Nissen noted that she would provide that information.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:29 p.m.

All fireworks are illegal in Riverside County because of the risk of serious injuries or fires. Riverside County has very diverse terrain with a lot of dry vegetation. Fireworks can easily start a brush fire in this environment. Individuals who cause fires by using illegal fireworks will be held responsible for all fire suppression costs. These costs can run into the millions of dollars.

Based on the high volume of calls related to fireworks during holidays such as the 4th of July, the Riverside County Sheriff's Department enacts a protocol to prioritize fireworks-related calls. The protocol will commence on July 3, 2016 at 10:00 PM, and conclude on July 5, 2016 at 1200 PM. The protocol is as follows:

Reports of fireworks, loud parties, or noise complaints will be broadcast to patrol deputies but a deputy will not respond unless the reporting party requests deputy contact. Deputies will continue to respond for reports of fires or gunshots.

Residential Projects Under Construction:

Tract 36382 – Lennar Homes (197 Units, Eastvale Project # 12-0275)

- Location: South side of Citrus Street between Scholar Way at Sumner Ave
 - Public Improvement 95% complete
 - Homes under construction
 - “No-Right Turn, 7-9am” symbol signs were added for eastbound Citrus Street traffic at Granja Vista Del Rio/ H.S. driveway beginning May 6, 2015.
 - Work on Citrus Avenue is complete

Tract 34014 – DR Horton – Copper Sky (224 Units, Eastvale Project # 13-0395)

- Location: Southeast corner of Schleisman Road at Scholar Way
 - Public Improvement 90% complete
 - Homes on Phase I south of Schleisman are under construction
 - Schleisman Rd was opened on March 29, 2015 for traffic.
 - Access from Beckett Field Lane was open to traffic on September 1, 2015.
 - Portion south of Schleisman Road near build-out
 - Riverboat Drive is complete

Tract 36423 – DR Horton (224, Units, Eastvale Project # 11-0558)

- Location: Northwest corner of Archibald Avenue at 65th Street
 - Public Improvement 90% complete
 - Homes under construction; few phases are occupied
 - SCE completed the relocation of transmission poles on November 20, 2015.
 - Widening of west side of Archibald between 65th and north project limits (including Providence Project frontage) to be completed in June 2016
 - Project near build-out

Tract 32821-1 – KB Home – The Lodge (205 Units, Eastvale Project 10-0124)

- Location: Northwest corner of Limonite at Scholar Way
 - Public Improvement 90% complete
 - Homes under construction; few phases are occupied
 - Developer is working to start grading of Phase II of the project (TR 32821, southwest corner of 58th and Scholar) in January 2016.
 - Model homes open
 - Construction and grading ongoing



On January 25, 2016, Request for Proposals (RFP) were issued for professional engineering services for Citywide Truck Route Study. Proposals were due on February 18, 2016, and three proposals were received. Public Works staff evaluated the proposals based on key personnel, understanding of the study, related experience, and schedule. The highest rated firm is Minagar & Associates, Inc. of Laguna Niguel, California.

On April 27, 2016 the City Council approved Professional Services Agreement with Minagar & Associates, Inc.

A kick-off meeting was held on June 1, 2016. Following is the action plan:

SUBJECT: RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING PROGRAM - UPDATE

RECOMMENDATION: RECEIVE REPORT FOR DISCUSSION AND PROVIDE DIRECTION TO STAFF.

BACKGROUND

At the May 24, 2016 Public Safety Commission meeting, staff presented a report on Residential Permit Parking Program. Both the benefits and challenges of the program were discussed by the Commission, with Chair Hook requesting additional information on what other cities in the area do.

DISCUSSION

In summary, the May report discussed Chair Hook's request of staff to do a research to implement a program to prohibit parking on public streets between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 4:00 a.m.

During staff's presentation questions were asked and discussed that include the following:

- Criteria to identify and determine the threshold(s) for a permit parking zone – Commissioner Flores
- Concerns of the permit parking program – Commissioner Flores
- Statistics on criminal activity in certain area, and correlation between crime rates and permit parking program – Chair Hook
- Process to identify and locate owner of suspicious vehicle – Commissioner Flores
- Existing/current permit parking zone in the City – Vice-Chair Khan
- Funding concerns on permit parking program, including using General Fund to subsidize the program – Commissioner Parilla
- Residents' involvement to report inoperable and/or parked vehicle over 72-hour period – Commissioner DaCosta
- How much time has been spent to research on permit parking program – Commissioner Parilla

Upon reviewing other cities' permit parking program including cities of Walnut, La Verne, San Dimas and Glendora, staff has the following summary;

- The restriction varies between the hours of 2:00 am and 4:00 am
- Temporary guest parking fee is between \$2 and \$5 each day
- Annual permit fee is between \$40 and \$75
- Permit kiosk is available in some cities, otherwise permit can be purchased at respective City Hall or Police Departments

To date, staff has spent approximately twenty hours to do research on the program, which is paid by the General Fund.

FISCAL IMPACT

The cost to implement a residential permit parking program is dependent on the number of permit parking zones and permit issued to administer annually. Additional staff resources would be needed to administer residential permit parking program, given the limited staff resources currently available. Although, permit fees are collected, the recovery costs are never adequate to fully cover the costs of administering the programs.
