HAVE YOU BEEN A VICTIM OF MAIL THEFT?



Here's What You Need To Do:

- If you see a crime in progress or suspect a mailbox break in is occurring, please call the local law enforcement by dialing 9-1-1.
- If the crime has already occurred, please call the Eastvale Police Non-Emergency line at (951) 776-1099.
- You must ALSO report this crime to the United States Postal Inspection Service at 1-877-876-2455 or visit their website at postalinspectors.uspis.gov.
- It may also be helpful for you to alert your neighbors and your Home Owners Association (where applicable).



WHAT IS UNITED STATES POSTAL INSPECTION SERVICE?

United States Postal Inspectors are federal law enforcement agents with investigative jurisdiction in all criminal matters involving the integrity and security of the U.S. Postal Service.



KNOW WHAT'S COMING TO YOUR MAILBOX

Sign up for Informed Delivery® to get digital images of the mail that will be placed in your mailbox each day.

Black and white images of your actual letter-sized mail pieces, processed by USPS® sorting equipment, will be provided to you each morning via email.



SAFEGUARD YOURSELF

- Drop off mail at your nearest Post Office or hand it to a letter carrier.
- Consider going paperless mail (i.e Email).
- Pick up mail promptly after delivery.
- Don't leave mail in your mailbox overnight.
- If you don't receive a check or other valuable mail that you're expecting, contact the issuing agency immediately.
- Don't send cash in the mail.
- Tell your Post Office when you'll be out of town, so they can hold your mail until you return.
- Consider starting a neighborhood watch program.
- Consult with your local postmaster for the most up-to-date regulations on mailboxes, including the availability of locked centralized or curbside mailboxes.
